MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

HELD WEDNESDAY 9TH NOVEMBER 2016

1. Attendance & Apologies

2. Minutes of the previous AGM & Matters Arising

Minutes of the previous AGM were re-issued to all members before the meeting.

First matter arising: Map Reading, Compass & Mountaincraft Training had still to be organised for club members. Explanations would be given under AOB.

Second matter: minute 7.2 incorrectly stated that proposal to limit coach journey times was made by Jenny Cameron. This was not the case, Alan apologised for the error.

It was proposed that the minutes be accepted; carried unanimously!

3. Chairman's Remarks

The Chairman said that we had experienced another good year, enjoying some good walks in great weather for most of the year. He wished to thank everyone for supporting the Club by attending walks; special thanks to the Secretary for all the good work he had done on behalf of the Club and for the good of its members.

He went on to say that there had been some concerns over the collection of fares and related matters – and urged members to take advantage of this opportunity, to ask questions during this meeting on any issues that may concern them.

4. Secretary's Report

- 4.1 Correspondence:
 - Coniston & Keswick MRT's emailed, thanking the Club for our generous donations.
 - David O'Hara, now self-employed, had emailed with notification of future charging policy for maintenance of our website.
 - Nevisport Online had made contact offering discount to our members. <u>Alan H is to</u> <u>follow-up.</u> Members are reminded that we have a long-standing discount agreement with Cotswold Outdoors, subject to production of a current Membership Card.
 - The Club had been contacted by a member of the Bright Water scheme, which aims to reveal, restore and celebrate the River Skerne catchment area. A 1.5 to 2 hour guided walk is proposed, starting and finishing at Bishop Middleham, likely to take place in March 2017. <u>Alan H is to follow up and arrange</u>.

- 4.2 2016 Outings: A summary of the year's walks was given; two main issues were identified, one being the high number of withdrawals from walks by those having previously used the pre-booking service, the second being the frailties of the coach toilet and the need for passengers to refrain from overuse. In future Alan will include comfort stops for return journeys, regardless of whether or not the coach has a toilet.
- 4.3 Trip Attendances: average 54.4 per trip (56.3 last year). It was noted that 8 members had managed to attend all 12 outings during the year; these were named: Adele, Nina Bell, Geoff Oldham, George, Jim Bonsall, Keith Dodds, Lenny & Alan. Well done to all! Weekend Away in Braithwaite had been the best yet with 34 attendees. Thanks to Jenny and friends for organising such a successful event.

Active Club Membership:

85 Adults, 1 S&SC members, 7 Life Members = Total 93 (on a par with 2015)

The Secretary wished to record his thanks to: -

Mick & the S&SC for a further £250 grant this year; Mick again, for organising the venue & bar for this evening's meeting; Jenny & her helpers for organising the weekend away to Braithwaite; Sheila, Maria, John and all on the committee for their efforts during the year; and last but not least all who have supported the Club by attending outings and/or purchasing Xmas draw tickets. Grateful thanks to all!

5. Treasurer's Report

The Accounts were presented for the financial year ending 31 October 2016.

Alan identified that whilst some trips had run at a loss, the annual surplus was £285, this being a further record for the Club. However, as a Club we are not in the business of generating profits & Alan's ambition in future is to reduce surplus to zero, plus or minus £10

Donations of £75 each had been made to the Coniston MRT and Keswick MRT. A further grant of £250 had been received from the Sports & Social Club.

Xmas draw, which had been downsized since previous years, realised a healthy surplus of \pounds 442.61; the Operating Result was \pounds 1,094.61 (within a few \pounds 's of the 2015 result); the Overall Result was \pounds 1,194.61 and our bank balance stood at a very healthy \pounds 8,952.16 It was proposed that the accounts be accepted; seconded & carried unanimously!

6. Election of Officers

Existing officers agreed to continue with the exception of Barry, who wished to stand down as Treasurer. Alan advised that he would continue to manage the accounts but that at some point in the future someone prepared to take on the duty would need to step forward!

7. Notices of Motion

1. **Trip Admin Problems**: The "Pre-Booking Service" (PBS) operates quite well but a significant number of those pre-booking then cancel, often just before the Tuesday midnight deadline. Following a late cancellation Alan H contacts those waiting on the

reserve list only to find that they have made other plans, so coach seats are left unoccupied. Alan proposed that the deadline for "cost-free" cancellations be moved forward to the Friday of the week before the walk, i.e. 8 days ahead of the outing. A vote on the implementation of this new deadline was carried, almost unanimously!

As a result of the above the following notification will appear on all future walk sheets, emailed prompts & reminder notices with regard to adoption of the new Friday deadline: -

"If you did not intend to make this reservation or have since found that you are unable to attend on the day, please notify the Secretary as soon as possible. Cancellations will be accepted at any time up to the Friday of the week before the outing. However, if you cancel after midnight Friday, i.e. 8 days before the outing, or "no-show" on the day, you will be asked to make full restitution for the lost fare. This will become payable on your next outing with the club"

2. A proposal to request that payment for late cancellation should be made promptly, i.e. before the date of the next outing, regardless of whether or not the debtor intended to join the next outing, was defeated. A counter proposal, that those in debt should be refused ongoing membership until debts were paid in full, was adopted. It was agreed that the trigger for when a second coach was hired would remain at 70, but that the Secretary reserved the right to use his judgement when arranging transport, to ensure demand from longer established members, especially when on Xmas outings etc, is met wherever possible.

Scramble For Seats!

The Secretary was anxious to clarify the coach seat Booking Process for those missing a walk & therefore unable to use the PBS. The 'Booking Office' only opens <u>after</u> the previous walk, i.e. after 9.00 pm on outing day. Therefore the best chance of gaining a coach seat on the following trip is to phone, text or email the Secretary just a few minutes after 9.00 pm on the Saturday evening. Communications received before this time will not be considered until 9.00 am Sunday morning! This is the only fare way, so that all members are treated the same!

8. Any Other Business

- RT Memorial: Eddy Adam had purchased a bench with plaque for Rob Turner, who was a well-liked long term member of the Club until his death in January 2015. £160 of the £205 cost had been raised through sales of books etc but this had left a shortfall of £45. A request for a special donation of £45 from Club funds was approved by members.
- 2. First Aiders: Alan H suggested that the First Aiders be re-trained (certificates for several were now out of date) and that First Aiders (we currently identify 8 individuals) should be equipped with suitable & appropriate First Aid packs to carry on walks. After some debate members agreed and accepted the proposal. <u>Alan is to pursue the re-training and procurement issues</u>. The following agreed to continue to act as First Aiders for the club: Jenny, Sheila, Maria, Adele, Christine, Isobel, Wendy & Ken (in his absence).

- 3. Selection of Walks: Sheila proposed that future Voting Sheets be rationalised to eliminate separate sections for coastal walks & canal walks. Lenny, in making a counter proposal, said the variety of walks was an essential element of Club outings. Lenny's proposal to leave the Voting Sheet as it currently appears was carried 29 votes to 5. Alan H suggested that with lateral thinking members not wishing to undertake a flat, level walk could, by checking maps, devise a walk that was routed away from the canal or coast. He also suggested that in future, when devising Walksheets, he would make a point of identifying such alternative routes.
- 4. **40th Anniversary Plans**: The initial outing in September 1977 took in the Three Yorkshire peaks. Alan H suggested an additional walk in September 2017 finishing at Horton-in-Ribblesdale to commemorate the first outing. His proposal was unanimously accepted and <u>Alan H is to organise appropriate post-walk celebrations</u>.
- 5. Public Liabilities: Alan H talked at length about how the club has evolved from being a wholly private club when first conceived to the current membership, where the club has only one S&SC member and the majority have never been S&SC members, nor company employees! The basis of his talk was the fact that the Club had evolved and was now a public concern, with many members joining from outside of the Company as a result of the website and other growth initiatives pursued by Sheila, Barry, Alan & others in 2012-13. Many prospective new members were enquiring about availability of guides; Alan's reaction to the enquirers was often "if you need to be guided then this is not the Club for you". He continued however to make the point that public concerns bring with them public liabilities. After much discussion it was proposed and widely accepted that the best way forward was to have all current and new members sign a waiver, acknowledging that the Club and Officials would not be held accountable should a serious accident befall anyone. The Waiver was to be a legally drawn up document and Alan H is to seek professional guidance on its structure & content.
- 6. Reserves Policy: Alan H talked about the need to have a Reserves Policy so that Minimum Reserve Funds could be established. This would in turn help determine what funds might be available for initiatives pertinent to the running of the Club including member training in the use of Map and Compass, Mountain-craft training, First Aid training, purchase of First Aid packs & other equipment, legal costs, promotional & advertising costs – and so on. Alan proposed that we should agree a Reserves Policy and have that policy added to our Constitutional document and Articles of Association. He suggested that to arrive at a sensible Reserves Policy we should consider a scenario where we suddenly lose 33% of our members, 33% of fares income, 33% of Xmas Draw income and cease to receive grants from any source. Alan advises that he has worked out that we need to keep a Minimum Reserve Fund of £6,000 to get us over such a significant downturn, which (in line with government guidance) could last 2 years! A slide, showing how our bank balance had increased over the period 1986 to 2016, was shown and, after further discussion, it was agreed and approved by a significant majority of members that a figure of £1,100 should be identified in relation to proposed spend on all training and equipment in 2017. Alan H is to organise a programme covering proposed initiatives!

- 7. **Archive**: Barry has prepared CD's containing copies of all of the Club's Walksheets, going back to the first outing in 1977. This has taken him many hours to compile and he is now making these available for a nominal cost of £5 each. All proceeds will be donated to a local Fell Rescue Team. Contact Barry or Alan if interested!
- 8. **Addendum**: Due to shortage of time the meeting failed to agree on the usual donations to Mountain Rescue Teams. Post meeting discussion between a few members has suggested that we should donate to two more MRT's in the area of the Dales £75 to each, <u>Alan H to determine recipients</u>. Hope this is acceptable to members!

9. Result of Voting for 2016 Walks Programme.

40 voted this year (compared to 50 last year)
