It will return via the same route.</li> <li>If you wish to undertake a walk not shown here, your coach will set you down at any safe and convenient point en-route.</li> <li>Coach park: Coach Park at East side of the town.</li> <li>There are plenty of pubs in Hawes. Crown Inn – Market Place – listed as busy. 3 regular beers (Black Sheep Best Bitter, John Smith's Bitter, Theakston Best Bitter) and 2 changing beers. Meals: 12 – 2, 6 – 8.45. Fountain Hotel – Market Place - (Free house) Good value food, served until 9pm in summer. Up to four guest ales usually from local breweries. White Hart Inn (Hotel) – Main Street - traditional bar and dining area, cask ales; quality wines; quality dining (recommend booking in advance) Board Inn – closed.</li> <li>In the event of an emergency during the walk, dial 999 and phone Enterprise Coaches (07917 880212/ 07532 802596) and/or send a text to Stephen Snowdon (07306 049450), advising the grid reference of your location.
